## **CURRICULUM OVERVIEW**

**ENGLISH** In pursuit of four required units of English in the Upper School, students begin their paths to one or two AP English courses with a rigorous foundational course freshman year.

**MATHEMATICS** Regular and Honors Algebra I, Geometry, and Algebra II are offered, in addition to three AP Math courses. Three units are required for graduation.

HISTORY Freshmen take World Cultures to develop a global perspective on various regions, cultures, and major religions. World Cultures fulfills a half unit in History and a half unit in Religion. Three history units are required for graduation, and seven AP History courses are offered.

**SCIENCE** Freshmen take regular or Honors Biology. Six AP Science courses are offered. Three science units are required for graduation.

CLASSICAL AND MODERN
LANGUAGES Students choose
between Regular or Honors Spanish,
French, Latin, and Mandarin Chinese.
Four AP Foreign Language courses are
offered. Three language units are required
for graduation.

**FINE ARTS** Freshmen choose one or more introductory courses in Acting, Band, Ceramics, Choir, Dance, Film

Studies, Speech, Strings, Studio Arts, and Theater Production. Four AP Fine Arts courses are offered. One year of fine arts is required for graduation.

Science courses are offered.

**ATHLETICS** ESD competes in the Southwest Preparatory Conference. Fall sports include football, cross country, crew, volleyball, field hockey, and cheerleading. Winter sports include basketball, soccer, and wrestling. Spring sports include lacrosse, baseball, softball, track and field, crew, golf, and tennis. Students may also choose from mountain biking, outdoor education, dance, personal fitness, or lifetime fitness activities. Six activity credits and a 1/2 unit health course are required for graduation. Freshmen can start with science-based Physiology of Health, or wait to take either Food Science or Anatomy and Physiology.

### **COMMUNITY SERVICE**
